💡 PRO TIP 💡

Avoid installing the bulb with bare hands, as oils from your fingers can create hot spots on the glass, causing heat to concentrate in one area and potentially shortening the bulb's lifespan or causing it to malfunction.

⚠️ IMPORTANT INFORMATION ⚠️

When unpacking and installing a light bulb, first turn off the power at the switch or breaker and let the fixture cool if it was recently used. Open the bulb's packaging gently over a soft surface and handle it by the base rather than the glass. Remove the old bulb carefully—unscrewing it counterclockwise for screw-type sockets or releasing it according to its connector—and dispose of it properly, especially CFLs, which require recycling. Make sure the new bulb matches the fixture's wattage and socket type, then insert it gently without overtightening. Restore power and test the light, and if it flickers or doesn't turn on, switch the power off again and check that the bulb is fully seated. Always avoid forcing a bulb, use a stable ladder for hard-to-reach fixtures, and clean up broken bulbs carefully using gloves.

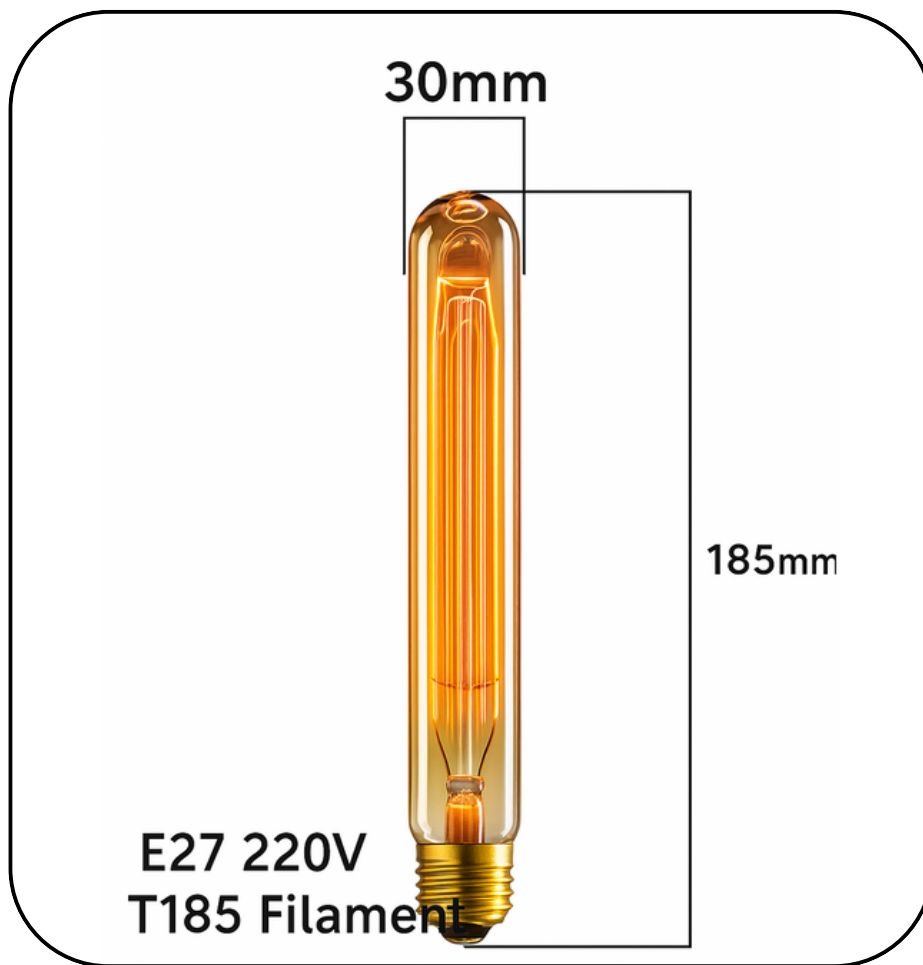
